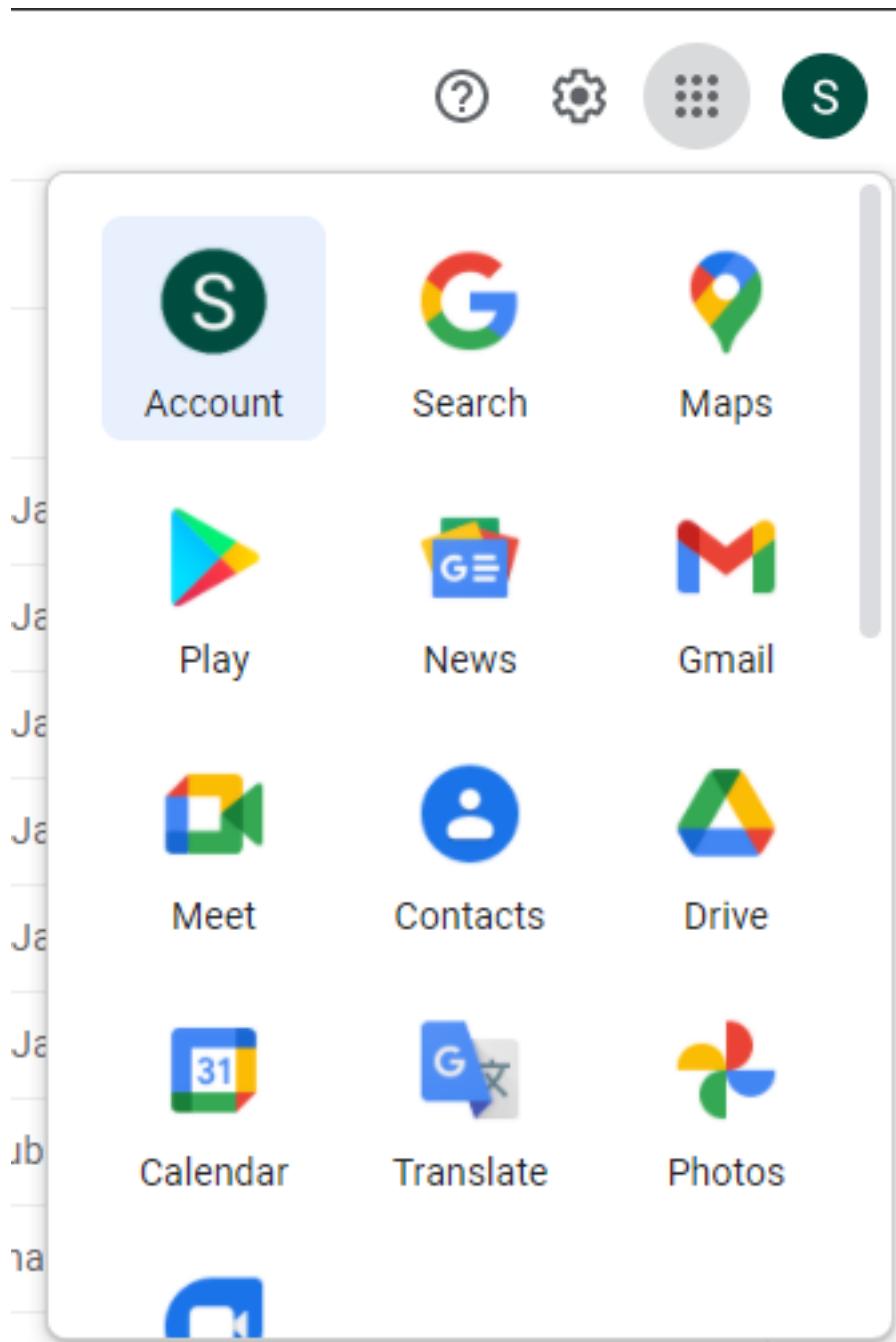



4. Replace your password with the 16-character password shown above.

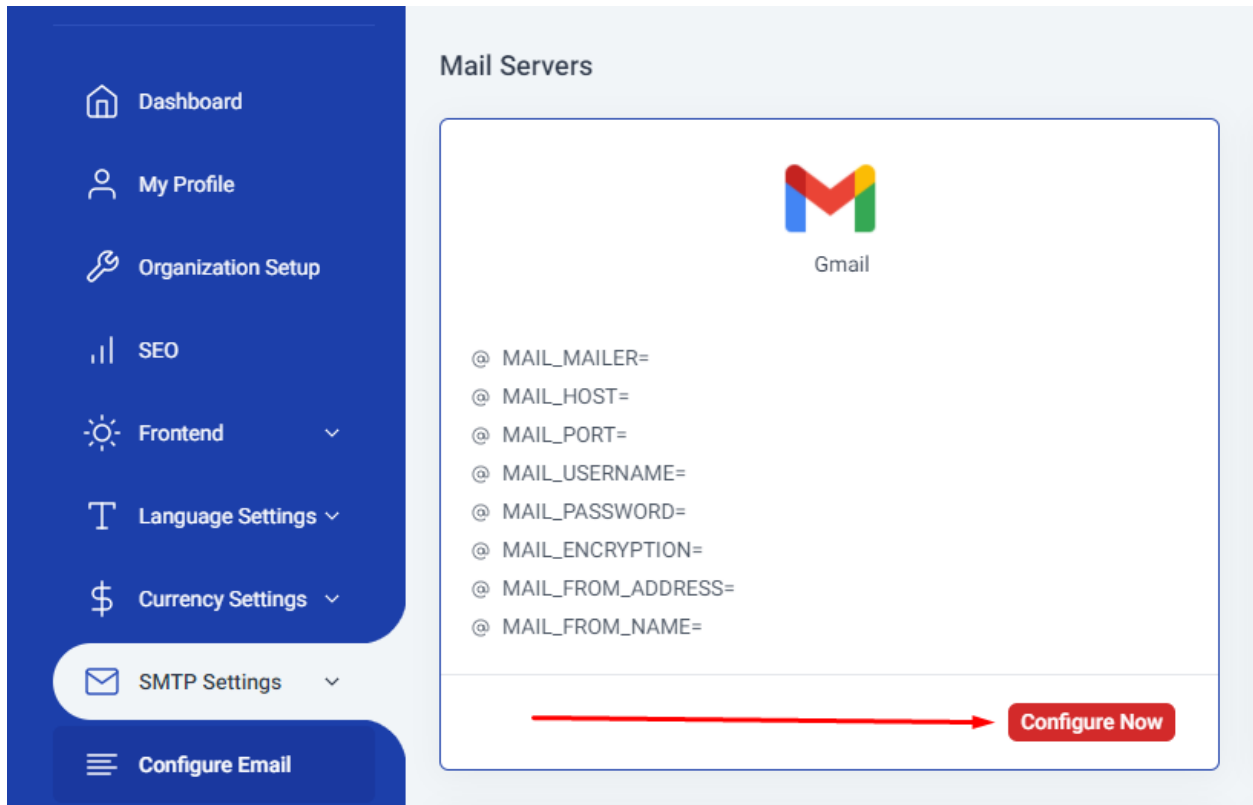
